

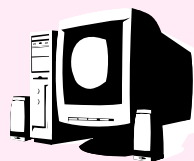

Business Loans

Business loans are available to help communities and individuals with business development or expansion along with the creation of jobs. Through this program, the Northeast South Dakota Economic Corporation, a sister corporation of NESDCAP, guarantees bank loans to small businesses, makes short and long term loans directly to businesses, participates in loans originated by other lenders and provides counseling and referrals.

Small Business Development Center

The mission of the Small Business Development Center (SBDC) is to help entrepreneurs realize their dream of business ownership as well as to assist existing businesses in their efforts to remain competitive. The SBDC offices provide professional, confidential and no-cost business consulting services, including one-on-one counseling and training, to individuals starting a business or looking for ways to improve an existing business. Dakota Dream Savings Fund

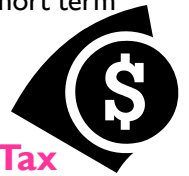
The Dakota Dream Savings Fund is an Individual Development Account set up to help individuals invest in their futures. Every dollar deposited into the Dakota Dream Savings Fund will be matched by a minimum of two dollars to help financially plan for:

- *Owning a home
- *Starting a business
- *Furthering your education

Guidance is provided along the way to ensure you're meeting your goals and understand how to financially support your dream.

Emergency Services

There may be unexpected circumstances that create a need for assistance with food, shelter, utilities, etc. Assistance is available for people who may have short term critical needs.



VITA— Volunteer Income Tax Assistance

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program (VITA) is designed to help low-income persons prepare their taxes for free. This service will be provided during the months of January through April.

Housing Programs

This is one of the largest programs in the organization. NESDCAP weatherizes houses to make them more energy efficient in order to reduce utility costs. Installing insulation, air sealing measures, or providing other minor repairs are some of the items that may be considered. Other NESDCAP programs may assist in replacing roofs, plumbing, electrical and heating systems through various funding sources.

Staff also work with housing technical assistance, multi-family housing, housing loans and marketing the "Governor's House". For additional information, request the "Housing Brochure".
